

Rescued and Given a Second Chance

Josie was a rescue who came to us from NYC. This poor sweet girl was found horribly neglected and abused, with terrible burn injuries on the skin of her face, legs, and upper body. Despite her traumatic past, when she came in she was very sweet with all the staff and wanted all the love and attention.

After a couple days at the APF, our team did a temperament test on her and noticed some resource guarding with food and toys. This isn't abnormal for pets coming from a situation like hers. She had been through significant trauma and had been in the shelter system since she was five months old. Our animal care staff started a behavior modification plan for resource guarding. Together, Josie and our staff members worked hard on changing those behaviors.



We are elated to share Josie was able to be adopted into a home that would give her all the love, cuddles, and attention she deserves.

Sawyer's Happy Ending



Sawyer was a five-month-old kitten found as a stray on the side of the road.

When he came into the APF, he had a severe eye infection requiring immediate medical intervention. The infection had caused his eye to rupture, and it needed to be removed. The APF made sure Sawyer got the treatment he needed to have a comfortable and happy life.

We are happy to announce that following his recovery, Sawyer found his forever home and is doing great. He adjusted right away after surgery, and we could all tell that he was feeling much better. He is now able to have the life he deserves, pain-free and in a loving home.

2023 IN REVIEW

Thanks to our amazing community of supporters, 2023 was a great year for the animals and people served by the Animal Protective Foundation. Following are a few of the highlights you made possible:



Our Pet Safety Net program launched four Community Pet Wellness Clinics throughout the region. These clinics helped more than 200 vulnerable animals and provided free vaccinations, exams, and care for those whose owners are struggling financially. In addition, the Pet Safety Net's Pet Food Pantry provided more than SEVEN TONS of food to struggling families.



For the first time since the APF opened the current shelter in 1993, we gutted our aged dog housing and rebuilt every inch to meet the standards of the Association of Shelter Veterinarians. Rather than a large single room, we now have created a room for each dog that is separated from disease, lowers noise, and creates a calmer environment so they are more comfortable until they find their forever home.



Our Community Spay/Neuter Clinic continues to be the largest public provider of spay/neuter surgeries in the region.

And, despite our dog housing being out of commission for more than four months during construction, we were able to find homes for 624 animals – only two less than 2022.

We are excited to continue improving the lives of companion animals through all our services in 2024 and beyond. Thank you for making all this possible.
